Marian University is a Catholic university founded and sponsored by the Congregation of Sisters of St. Agnes, a religious congregation that began in 1858 in Wisconsin.

At Marian University, you will encounter a Catholic environment where the Catholic intellectual tradition influences our decisions, activities, and service to others. You will find a hospitable environment where people of all religious and faith backgrounds are welcomed and encouraged to dialogue with one another.

How Marian University expresses itself as a Catholic university is evidenced in the following ways:

- **Academic Life**

All academic disciplines at Marian University recognize the fact that the Catholic intellectual tradition of “faith seeking understanding” is core to Marian’s identity. Faculty members strive to help students integrate faith and reason within their courses. In particular, undergraduate students are required to take three credits (*one course*) in Philosophy and six credits (*two courses*) in Theology.

- **Prayer and Worship**

There is an active prayer and liturgical life on campus. Students may participate in and/or take a leadership role in weekly Mass, Feast Day celebrations, sacramental opportunities, traditional devotional practices (*Rosary and Stations of the Cross, for example*), and other prayer services.

- **Campus Ministry**

Marian University offers a vibrant Campus Ministry Club and a full-time Campus Minister. Students of all religious backgrounds may develop and deepen their faith life through such Campus Ministry activities as faith sharing, Bible study, retreats, discussion groups, and service to others. Students may also participate in the Dorcas Chapel Liturgical Choir and other liturgical ministries.

- **Moral Development**

At Marian University, workshops, conferences, and speakers, as well as certain courses, policies and procedures, are offered to help students develop a moral integrity that leads them to act with compassion and justice. The Social Justice Committee’s monthly Speaker Series plays an important role in this development.

- **Service and Social Justice**

There is a commitment to uphold the social and moral teachings of the Catholic Church. A variety of service opportunities exists such as serving at meal programs, building houses, and visiting with elderly members of our community. Various speakers, cultural events, concerts, and service-learning experiences further help the Marian community remember and reflect upon church and societal issues that affect people, especially those whose faith life or human dignity is threatened in any way.
