Grades 5–12 • Early Adolescence–Adolescence

Freshman Year

Students will complete 24–36 credits of liberal arts courses, in consultation with the education academic advisor and the major academic advisor.

Sophomore Year

Students will complete an additional 24–36 credits which could include liberal arts courses and major courses, Field Experience One, and 100- and 200-level Education courses. Requirements to begin the field experience and education classes include:

- Completion of 30 credits.
- Cumulative GPA of 2.75.
- Completion of Core Academic Skills for Educators Test (formerly PPST) with passing scores on at least two of the tests.

Junior and Senior Years

Students complete the remaining liberal arts courses early in their junior year and continue completing courses in their major and 300- and 400-level Education courses, including Field Experiences Three and Four.

Clinical Practice (12 credits)

The clinical practice experience takes place after all coursework has been completed and the following requirements have been met:

- Completion of the Praxis II Content test for the major completed.
- Completion of the admission to Clinical Practice Portfolio, which includes 30 hours of human relations experience.
- Minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0.

Upon completion of this program will be eligible for the Early Adolescence–Adolescence (EA-A) license, Code 73 in the major (and a licensable minor if completed).
