Yeats*), climb Benbulbin and hike the Giant's Causeway and Carrick Rede Rope Bridge, attend lectures at the Apprentice Boys Hall and Centre for Migration Studies, visit several historical sites, memorials and museums, and much, much more! Take advantage of this extraordinary opportunity to explore a fascinating culture with old and new friends.

The 12-day trip will include travel to Dublin, and Sligo, Ireland and Belfast and Derry, Northern Ireland.
