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## **Elementary/Middle Education (EME)**

- Ages 6 through 12/13 (grades 1 - 8)

## **Special Education (SPE)**

- Ages 5 through 21 (grades K – 12)

## **Middle/Secondary Education (MSE)**

- Ages 10 through 21 (grades 5 – 12)

# Program Requirements

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## **Elementary/Middle Education**

- Licensable minor required
  - or Special Education (double major)

## **Special Education**

- Licensable minor required
  - EME, or MSE (double major)

## **Middle/Secondary Education**

- Double major (content area) required
  - English Education
  - Broad Field Social Studies
    - History concentration
  - Biology
  - Chemistry
  - Mathematics

# Non-Licensure Education Programs

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## **Educational Studies (major)**

- Professional coursework to prepare students for careers in education-related role as a Paraprofessional.

- Particularly relevant for those planning to teach in parochial or private setting

# Anticipated Costs

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## ***Sophomore Year: Entrance Testing***

- Reading, writing, mathematics comprehension
  - Not required if ACT composite score of 23+
  - Praxis CORE - \$90/test (3 required)
  - Accuplacer - \$2.50/test (4 required)

## ***Junior Year: Foundations of Reading Test (FORT)***

- Reading instruction knowledge and skills
  - Approximately \$139

## ***Senior Year: Content Knowledge Testing***

- Related to licensure area
  - Not required with 3.0 GPA in content area
  - Approximately \$120/test

## ***Senior Year: edTPA***

- Portfolio to demonstrate effective teaching
  - \$300

## ***Upon Graduation: Educator License***

- WI Dept. of Public Instruction
  - Approximately \$125
