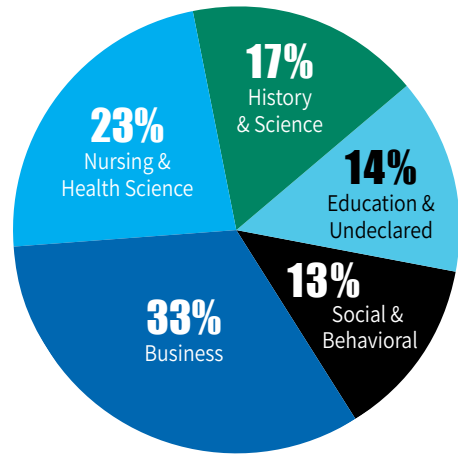

Looking for the traditional college living experience? This three story co-ed facility is home to most first-year students.

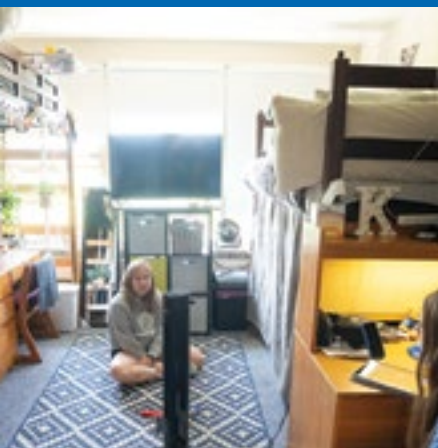


Courtyards

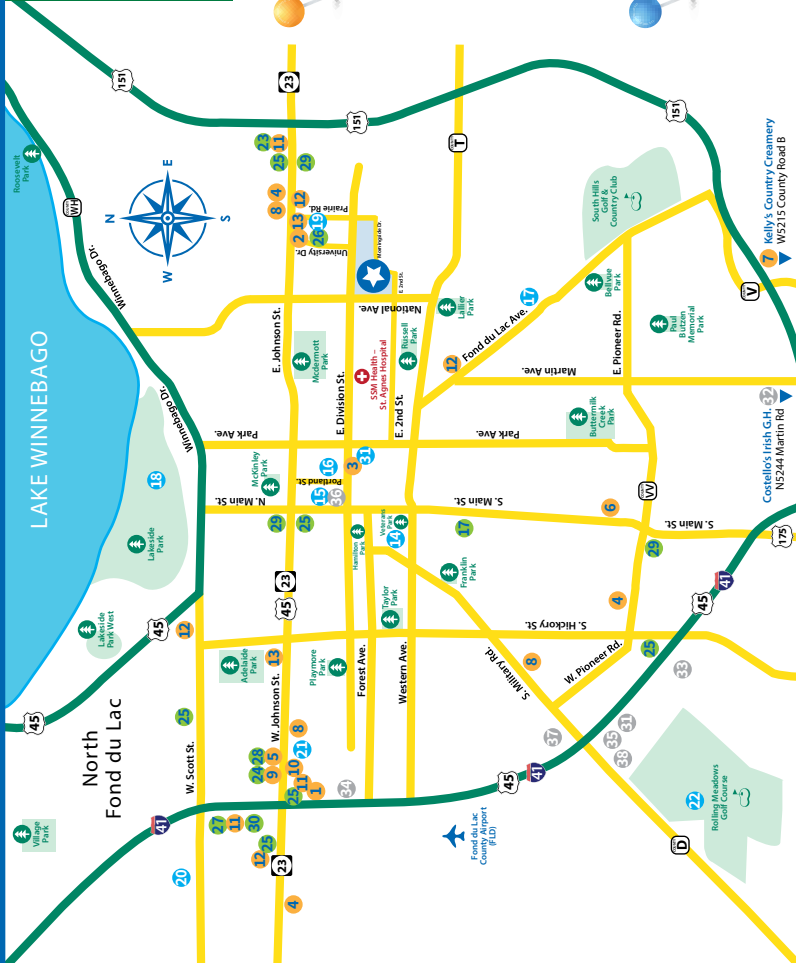

The Marian Athletics **women's teams** had their best finish ever in the NACC All-Sports Standings.



Yinan Lu became the first medalist in women's golf history at the NACC Championship and **Jaysen Spanbauer** of men's bowling earned an Individual National Championship the first in the history of Marian athletics.

Educational opportunities shouldn't be limited by your ability to pay. We offer several resources to make paying for school possible.

Admission Scholarships

Our admission scholarships awarded to eligible students are not based on financial need or athletic ability, and are guaranteed until graduation as long as you maintain a cumulative 2.00 GPA or higher and remain a full-time student. Additional scholarships based on academic interest, participation in ROTC, and other achievements are also available.

Legacy Awards

Legacy Awards are available to relatives of a Sister of the Congregation of Sisters of St. Agnes (CSA), as well as grandchildren, children, legal guardians, parents, siblings and spouses of a Marian graduate. Also, students enrolled full time in the traditional undergraduate program who have a sibling, parent, guardian, child, spouse, or grandparent concurrently enrolled full time in a traditional undergraduate program will receive a Legacy Award. **\$2,000 per year.**

Early Sabre Award

Freshman and transfer students who apply and are admitted prior to Jan. 1 receive **\$1,000 per academic year.**



Out of State Award

Students must reside in the United States (excluding Wisconsin). **\$2,000 per year.**

Sr. Mary Mollison Legacy Scholarship	\$16,000	WITH TEST: GPA 2.80 or higher, and ACT 22–25/SAT 1100–1230 NO TEST: GPA 3.01–3.49
Trustee Scholarship	\$15,000	WITH TEST: GPA 2.50–2.79, and ACT 21–25/SAT1060–1230 NO TEST: GPA 2.80–3.00
Naber Scholarship/ Sr. Mary Sheila Burns Award	\$14,000	WITH TEST: GPA 2.49 or lower, and ACT 21–25/SAT 1060–1230 NO TEST: GPA 2.79 or lower
Catholic High Schools Scholarship	\$15,000	This partnership award is given to students graduating from a Catholic high school, with a minimum high school 2.00 GPA, and enrolling at Marian the fall after high school graduation.
Partnership High School Award	\$15,000	This award is given to any applicant who has graduated with a 2.00 Grade Point Average from one of our affiliate high schools.

GPA criteria is based on the high school cumulative grade point average using an unweighted 4.00 grading scale. If multiple ACT/SATs taken, criteria is based on composite “superscore” by averaging the best scores from each subject. SAT scores are Reading + Math, and are for tests taken March 2016 or later.
